Founder Introduction




- Proud Father: Two adult children including a life-long cancer survivor.






Geographic Coverage

In the Sparks Mentorship Program, we are committed to mentoring the whole person.

Sparks Mentorship Program Objectives



- Developmental Experiences: Provide guidance on internships and other developmental experiences in their college years
- Academic Support: Provide guidance on course selection, study habits, and time management to improve academic performance.
- Career Guidance: Assist students in exploring career options, building professional networks, and preparing for the job market.
- Skill Development: Focus on developing soft skills such as communication, leadership, and teamwork.
- Work-Life Balance: Coach on strategies to balance academic responsibilities with personal life.
- Financial Literacy: Educate about budgeting and financial planning
- Personal Growth: Encourage self-awareness, confidence-building, and personal goal setting.

- Undergraduate Students: We mentor college undergraduates, from rising freshmen to graduating seniors, across all
 majors and fields of study.
- Current Focus on Business: While we welcome students from any discipline, our current partnerships with business schools mean there's a strong need for mentors with business expertise.
- Beyond Business: We accept and encourage applications from students outside the business field and will work to find
 mentors who match their academic and career interests.
- High-Impact Mentorship: Our primary goal is to provide a valuable and personalized mentorship experience that helps students achieve their academic, personal, and professional aspirations.



Mentor Responsibilities



- Goal Setting: Help your student define clear mentorship goals, with them taking the lead in setting the direction.
- Collaborative Meetings: Work together to create meeting agendas and topics based on the student's goals and progress from prior sessions.
- Monitor and Adjust: Regularly review the student's development and adjust as needed to ensure they stay on track.
- Career & Academic Guidance: Support students in aligning their academic choices with career goals, offering advice on relevant courses, internships, and skill-building for long-term success.
- Personal Coaching: Support the student in growing as a person in areas such as personal finances or other life skills where needed or requested.
- Provide Constructive Feedback: Continuously seek feedback from your student to improve the mentorship experience
 and adapt to their evolving needs.
- Reporting: Complete a brief two-question survey after each session to monitor mentorship progress and status, ensuring
 the program provides ongoing support for both student and mentor.

Mentor Qualifications



- Professional Experience: Minimum of 10 years in a professional setting, with at least 5 years in a management or leadership role, OR extensive experience developing others.
- Diverse Backgrounds Welcome: We seek both retired and active professionals from a variety of industries, ensuring a wide range of expertise for our students.
- Passion for Mentorship: A genuine desire to teach, share knowledge, and help guide college students through their academic and career journey.
- Educational Foundation: A four-year college degree, providing the ability to relate to the college experience and offer relevant guidance.
- Commitment: Willingness to invest 1 hour per month over a 12-month period (not including preparation time) to support
 a student's growth and development.
- Flexible Guidelines: While these are our general guidelines, we recognize exceptions on a case-by-case basis to
 accommodate a variety of mentoring experiences and backgrounds.

Matching Process



- Tailored Matching: Students are matched with mentors based on their major, goals, and specific preferences outlined in their application.
- Network-Driven Support: If a student's application doesn't align with a currently available Sparks Mentor, we actively
 seek a mentor within the network of the founder, Advisory Board, or existing mentors to find and onboard a suitable
 match.
- Proposed Matches: When a potential match is identified, the student's profile is presented to the mentor for approval before moving forward.
- Mentorship Start: Once the mentor accepts the match, both the student and mentor receive an acceptance notification. The student's preferred start date, as indicated in their application, will be confirmed to initiate the mentorship.



Mentorship Foundation



- Student-Driven Goals: The mentorship is centered around the goals that each student outlines in their application. These goals are further refined during the first two meetings to ensure alignment with their aspirations.
- Standardized Framework: The program uses a set of 40+ Mentorship Standards that act as a guideline. Mentors and students review these standards together to decide which are most relevant and valuable for their specific mentorship journey.
- Customized Approach: While we provide a structured foundation, the mentorship is flexible, allowing each student-mentor pair to focus on the areas that matter most to the student's personal and professional growth.



The Mentorship Process



- Roles: The student drives the mentorship process by setting goals, while the mentor offers perspective, knowledge, and resources to help them achieve those goals.
- Duration: The mentorship includes a monthly 60min mentoring session over the course of one year.

- Sparky Mentor Helper: All assistant offering real-time support and resources relating to our platform.






















Lumen™ Mentorship Manager



- Single Sheet of Music: Lumen is where mentors and students work together and stay on the same page to manage mentorship activities.
- Goals and Actions Tracking: Helps create and track both big-picture goals and the specific actions needed to achieve them.
- Step-by-Step Process: Guides users through setting goals, planning actions, and tracking completion.
- Shared Responsibility: Students can add their own goals and actions while mentors provide guidance.
- Control Options: Lets mentors decide when students can edit goals/actions and when they can only view them.
- **Easy Communication:** Provides areas for private notes and shared feedback on both goals and actions.
- Progress Reports: Shows how far students have come on both goals and specific action items.
- Helpful Assistant: Includes Sparky, a chatbot that answers questions about using Lumen.
